Home-School Collaboration

To foster a culture of excellence and lifelong learning in students requires a strong partnership between the school and our homes. This is crucial for the overall development and success of our students. To encourage this collaboration, we have deployed an online platform (LMS) that shares critical academic information on the progress of every student and facilitates communication between the school and families. Parents are encouraged to periodically use our online platform to check for updates on their children's education. Furthermore, we encourage parents' participation in school activities and events, and we are open to discussion on students' progress, areas for improvement, and strategies for support both in school and at home.

The Role of Discipline

Just like in all worthwhile pursuits, discipline is critical to academic success of students. Discipline helps students to remain focused and develop consistent study habits that lead to improved performance. They are able to set goals, prioritize task and stay committed to achieving them. However, students who show certain negative character traits are generally distracted from learning and lose interest in academic work. If we are to build a strong learning community, discipline must be embraced both in school and at homes. For instance, while occasional late coming to school may be excused, a habitual tardiness is an indication of underlying weakness and indiscipline which will lead to other negative ripple effects.

New School Structure and Culture

From the next school year, Graceland College will be separated into a High School for $10^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade students and a Middle School for $7^{th} - 9^{th}$ graders. The Middle School is located at #16 Park Avenue, GRA, just beside DSS, on the way to New Market through Parklane Hospital. Therefore, all returning Junior School students will resume at the Middle School from September 2024. Amongst other advantages, this strategic movement will enhance discipline, students control and the management of students' behaviour. It will also help manage students' population and create a more conducive learning environment and most importantly, it will provide an opportunity for a school-wide paradigm shift in culture, leadership, management, orientation and discipline. We welcome you to our transformational move. This is just a new dawn in Graceland Schools!

Compulsory Boarding for Final Year Class

With the new school structure in view, and envisaged boarding space, we would like all 12th grade students to board **from next session** as a way to create a unique teaching and learning **experience** in their final exams year.
